Welcome to World History/BRVGS! This course will examine the history, technologies, physical features and cultures of various regions of the world from prehistory through present day, using the World History I curriculum. Through the analysis of course topics, we will uncover and understand the various political and economic systems, ideologies, and conflicts throughout history. Students will be required to think critically and analytically and will express such thoughts through written assignments, class activities and project based learning. Students will be required to take the World History I SOL in December.

Classroom Values: The following expectations apply to everyone, everyday.

- 8. Have pride in your work and be willing to think critically.

Academic Expectations:

- 1. MAKE-UP WORK:
 - a. STUDENTS are responsible for make-up work. Be sure to check GoogleClassroom if you are absent. Please do not wait for your teacher to initiate make-up work or to seek you out to make up a test or quiz.
 - b. Procure any class notes missed either from a classmate, Google Classroom, or

- your teacher upon your return.
- c. The student and Mrs. Johnston will make arrangements for the appropriate time frame to have make-up work completed, *however*, a general rule is that work should be completed within the number of days the student was absent.
- d. **SPECIAL NOTE**: If a student is absent the day a test or quiz is given, OR the day an assignment is due, the student should be prepared to take the test or quiz, or submit the assignment, upon his/her return to class.
- LATE WORK: Late work will not be accepted after 5 school days beyond the due date for credit. Extenuating circumstances may be the exception. The overall score for late work will be deducted by 10 points per day.
