CELL PHONES will not be allowed during instruction or creation time in the classroom. In order to photograph student artwork, **CELL PHONES** may be used during the last 10 minutes of class with permission from Ms.Junto. A photography unit using student cell phone cameras will be an exception. No texting or social media activity will be allowed. MCHS' cell phone policy will be strictly followed.

Each unit/module and project will be explained in the classroom and in Canvas (online learning

program). When a project is finished each completed project will be photographed by the student and the student and the photographed by the student and the student and the student and the student and the studen submitted to a specific project submission page in Art 3's Canvas. Edited cell phone photos and/or art room "loaner camera photos" are acceptable. In addition, students will write a reflection. A quality photo(s) of the artwork must be submitted to Canvas in order to earn a grade.

Most projects will be chosen by the art student so a reasonable date of completion will be stated in the first written goal for the project. Weekly goals will be written and submitted to the student's digital Creativity Book. The goals will not be graded if submitted later than Tuesday of that week. The due date will be dependent on the scope of the project and based on committed work habits of the student. The deadline may be adjusted as the project continues and will be determined by discussion between the student and teacher. Students with excused absences will be given additional time to complete a project – on a case by case basis after discussion with Ms. Junto and her written approval that will include a new established date.

Work expected during absences

If a student is absent for 2 days or more, it is highly recommended a student refers to Canvas and work at home on the assignments posted during the absence.

Grades are earned, not given! Grades will be determined based on the student's performance in the following areas: creativity, addressing assignment specifics, craftsmanship, written reflections, research, quizzes, studio maintenance, timely completion of assignments, and warm up activities.

The Final Exam will be a digital portfolio called a "Creativity Book" that consists of a collection of projects and written reflections that demonstrate the student's growth and understanding of Art 1 concepts and skills. Students need to contribute to this digital portfolio throughout the semester.

The exam grade is significant and counts 10% of a student's final grade.
