

- Core classes only

#4 Extra/Co-curricular Accomplishments

- Complete Brag Sheet (Naviance)
- Prepare resume
- Answer Teacher & Counselor Recommendation Questions (Naviance)
- Include skills & special interests

Emphasize:

- Leadership positions
- Community involvement
- Activities that show your commitment or dedication



#5 Personal Statement/Essay

- Do not repeat information given in application
- Be creative
- Check spelling
- Write & rewrite
- Have a teacher review it for you.



#6 Letters of Recommendation

 Personally ask core teachers, administrators, and/or counselors you've identified for letters of recommendation

• Follow up with email requests through Naviance.



Okay, I'm ready to apply...

 Read the entire application & directions carefully. Pay close attention to dates/deadlines.

 Start with the simple apps first then progress to the more complex ones (Common App)

The Process

- Collect data
- Make a copy of app. and practice filling one in.
- Be accurate & truthful do not exaggerate your accomplishments.
- Proofread, Proofread, Proofread! Missing information could delay decisions.
- Be clear in your responses; avoid being vague.

Definitions

- Early Decision is binding, can apply to only 1 college for early decision
- Early Action is non-binding
- Regular Decision
- Waitlisted
- Denied

Deadlines

Early Action Early Decision

- November 1
- November 15
- December 1
- December 15

Regular Decision

- January 1st
- January 15th
