PARKING RULES

1. Parking permit must be clearly visible at all times.
2. Vehicle must be operated in a safe and legal manner at all times. The maximum speed limit on school grounds is 15 mph. All vehicles are to adhere to all State regulations.
3. Drivers must yield to pedestrians at all times.
4. Students must park their vehicle and enter the building upon arrival to school. Students may not “hang out” in the parking lot during the school day. Students are not to return to their vehicles during the school day **unless an emergency** and without prior permission from an administrator and must be walked by a designated staff member at all times.
5. Students will not be permitted to leave school during school hours except with prior approval from both parent/guardian and principal.
6. Cars not parked correctly or in the correct space may be ticketed or towed.
7. Any vehicle parked on school property is subject under Virginia Law to be searched by school administration.

*Any violation of parking rules may result in loss of parking privileges, ticketing, or towing at owner’s expense. **In addition, excessive tardies or unsatisfactory attendance & code of conduct violations may also result in loss of parking/driving privileges.***

8. **Parking permits are non-transferable from student to student, you must go through the front office.**

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PARKING PASS APPLICATION

Va. Code § 22.1-205.1: Each public high school shall require any student who applies to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property to provide evidence that the student possesses a valid driver's license or driver privilege card. The Department of Education shall develop, and each public high school shall utilize, a standard application form for students to use to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Teen Driving Restrictions

Virginia's driving restrictions are not meant to penalize teen drivers, but to help them stay safe while they gain valuable driving experience. Studies have found that these restrictions work to reduce the number of car crashes among young drivers.

Curfew Restrictions

If you are under age 18, Virginia law prohibits you from driving between midnight and 4 A.M. except when driving:

- to or from a place of business where you are employed;
- to or from an activity that is supervised by an adult and is sponsored by a school or by a civic, religious, or public organization;
- with a licensed spouse age 18 or older, parent or other adult acting in loco parentis who is occupying the front passenger seat,
- in case of an emergency, including responding to emergency calls as a volunteer firefighter or rescue squad personnel.

Restrictions on the Number of Passengers

If you are under age 18, you may carry only one passenger under age 21, unless accompanied by a licensed parent, or other adult acting in place of a parent, in the front passenger seat. However, after you have held your license for one year, you may carry up to three passengers under age 21 in the following situations:

- Travel to and from a school-sponsored activity;
- A licensed driver 21 or older is in the front passenger seat; or
- In case of an emergency.

Learner's permit holders may not carry more than one passenger under age 18.
(Passenger restrictions do not apply to family members)

Cellular Telephone Restrictions

§ 46.2-818.2. Virginia's cellular telephone law prohibits any person from holding a handheld personal communications device while driving a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the Commonwealth.
